Parking

I know that it can be difficult to park near to the school both in the morning and afternoon. I know a great number of families are avoiding this issue by walking to and from school, which is both better for the environment and is a healthier option. However, we realise that some families need to use the car but may I ask that you park in a safe, appropriate space.

We have had a number of complaints from residents who live in and around Worsley Bridge Road. Some parents are parking across drives, which inconveniences those properties that need access of these driveways; others are parking on private property, namely the car ports for neighbouring flats. We have had additional complaints that when confronted by residents, parents of the school have been less than helpful. Please help us and local community by parking sensibly and appropriately.

Please avoid parking across the bus stop outside the pupil gate and further down adjacent to the school fence on Worsley Bridge Road. This does prevent the flow of traffic, particularly when the bus needs to stop and pick up passengers.
