

### English

Throughout the summer term we will be reading the London Eye Mystery by Siobhan Dowd. Children will be continuing to enhance their reading skills through this book, particularly their use of inference. In addition to this children will be writing persuasive tourist leaflets, formal letters and newspaper reports. They will also be given the opportunity to use a range of narrative style writing to complete their written assessment checklists. Children will continue to learn a range of grammatical features and spelling rules in order to help control their extended pieces of writing. Speaking and listening will be incorporated and children will regularly be encouraged to discuss their thoughts and understanding of the themes raised in the books.

Year 6 children will be rehearsing and performing their end of year production which provides many opportunities for developing their drama skills.

### Maths

Prior to SATS, children will be consolidating their knowledge of all areas taught in KS2, including: Place value, fractions, percentages and decimals, shape and space, statistics, measures and algebra.

After SATS they will be completing various extended maths projects to prepare them for the KS3 curriculum and encourage them to apply their maths to the real world. This will include designing their own funfair, creating and selling items to make a profit and preparing various recipe scenarios.

### Art / Design and Technology

Children will create their own landscapes of London using charcoal techniques. They will study and practise the art of mark marking and be incorporate this into a still life piece of work.

Leading up to world cup day, children will be given the independence to design, make and evaluate an emblem of their choice using inspiration from emblems throughout history.

### Science & PSHE

The human body will be the focus learning area during the summer term. They will study the various systems in the body, including the digestive, circulatory and reproductive systems.

Children will also be given the opportunity to explore magnets and magnetic materials and their relationship with the magnetic poles. Children will take part in various practical experiments to reinforce their learning in this area.

### History

The children will be focusing on key events through history that took place in London. In particular, children will be closely studying the Great Plague and the effect it had on the people of London as well as businesses and everyday life. Children will also learn about the Great Stink and why both of these situations are fully avoidable today.



### Geography

Children will be learning about the different stages in the journey of a river. They will be looking at case studies about some of the largest rivers in the world. This will lead to an evaluation regarding the impact of the Thames on London and its surrounding areas.

Children will be learning skills to incorporate into gymnastic routines. These will include the use of apparatus. After half term, the children will participate in topic-themed dance lessons from an outside agency.

### Computing

Children will using an iMovie programme to combine, edit and create their own Newsround report. This will be based on their class book and will allow children to explore various outcomes of dramatic scenarios.

### Homework

Each child will receive a piece of maths, English along with a topic homework, which they will select themselves from a menu, on a Monday. Each piece is to be presented to a high standard and returned on Friday. Exceptional pieces will be rewarded and displayed on our WOW wall

### Languages

Children will continue to further their understanding of key phrases in various European languages, including simple greetings, expressing favourites and naming colours and everyday objects within the classroom.
