

<p style="text-align: center;">English</p> <p>Using the Power of Reading book of “<i>Street Child</i>” we will be exploring a range of different writing genres: description, persuasion, information texts, instructions and diary writing. The focus in grammar will be on punctuating speech correctly and characterising speech using E.A.S.T. (emotion, action, speech, thoughts). We will also explore ways to enrich the vocabulary we use in our writing. The children will be encouraged to apply their grammar and spelling knowledge in their everyday writing. In reading, children will develop their speed and accuracy in answering comprehension questions.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Maths</p> <p>In Maths, the children will consolidate and extend their knowledge of place value and the number system. They then will learn how to add, subtract, multiply and divide using efficient formal written methods. They will also be applying the skills and knowledge gained to take their thinking to a deeper level and apply them to real life situations and solve problems. The children are expected to be able to rapidly recall their times table and related division facts from $\times 1$ - $\times 12$, up to the $12 \times$ table. They will need to practise their times tables regularly.</p>	
<p style="text-align: center;">Science</p> <p>Children will learn about different materials, their uses and their properties, as well as dissolving, separating mixtures and irreversible changes. They will work scientifically and collaboratively in investigations, making predictions and writing up experiments.</p>		<p style="text-align: center;">Computing</p> <p>Using Purple Mash, we will continue to develop our skills in coding. Within this we will design, write and debug programs that accomplish specific goals. We continue to learn about on-line safety and the importance of using technology safely, respectfully and responsibly.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">History</p> <p>We will explore and investigate who Queen Victoria was and what she was like. We will discover what life was like for the Victorians and explore some of the social and technological advances of the time, as well as looking at leisure, the arts and entertainment.</p>	<p style="color: green;">Why was Crystal Palace so important to the Victorians?</p> 	<p style="text-align: center;">Geography</p> <p>Using a variety of sources to gain information such as maps and atlases. The children will locate the countries that made up the British Empire during the Victorian era, focusing on the key physical and human characteristics about India - the jewel in the crown.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Art, design and technology</p> <p>The children will find out about the artist William Morris and who he was and what kind of art he produced before going on to design their own wallpaper design based on the work of Morris. Children will print their own designs</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">RE and PSHE</p> <p>Through the study of Hinduism we will explore the big questions such as “<i>Do beliefs in Karma, Samsara and Moksha help Hindus lead good lives?</i>” In PSHE, we will look at acts of kindness and how we can learn to be kind to our friends.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Enrichment</p> <p>We will learn about Victorian music halls and why they were so popular. In addition, we will learn the African drums with a specialist teacher. Swimming will take place on Friday mornings where children will be taught by specialist swimming teachers.</p>
