Zema Fit 5km Run



The Zema Fit Champions programme was created by myself, Negus Majesty Mclean, a well-respected entrepreneur, mentor and fitness coach in the Lewisham borough. The programme is designed to help positively impact the growing statistic of obesity and mental health in our community, especially in young children aged between 9 and 12 years old.

According to data from the National Child

Measurement Programme (NCMP), 9.6% of reception age children (age 4-5) are obese, with a further 13.0% overweight. These proportions are higher among year 6 children (age 10-11), with 20.0% being obese and 14.3% overweight.

Being heavily involved in the fitness world and coaching children of a similar age, lead me to creating this programme which I believe is a big step in the right direction. I aim to put on a series of 5k runs across every borough in London. These 5k runs will not only be family friendly and available for anyone to join in, but they will also be Free of charge.

Silent Noise Events have kindly offered to sponsor the first run. They will be providing all 100 of our attendees with headphones to enhance their running experience.

Zema Fit Champions Programme Presents: 'The Music Motivation 5k Run' Christmas Party Edition

All runners will be given headphones with 3 main channels to pick from. All 3 channels will be home to a different genre easily adaptable to suite their personal preference. The headphones are fitted with LED lights that change colour every time the channel changes. This adds to the fun as our runners will be able to manoeuvre through the channels gaging the more popular ones, and thus creating an electric atmosphere.
