Young Writers Workshop And Our Next Challenge

After celebrating Veer (our Young Writers Literacy Champion) in assembly, 20 of our published authors were lucky to spend one hour with poet-rapper Mark Grist, where they understood that a good writer is original and resilient. The children learnt to write poems with a twist and really enjoyed discovering the beauty of writing poetry. Here is what they thought of it: Scarlet, year 5 - "Don't ever copy someone else's work - it'll be boring."; Tallula, year 6 - "The workshop interested me because of the games that we played to help us work on being original and resilient with our writing."; Polly, year 5 - "The Young Writers Workshop taught me how to write a poem and be original, avoiding clichés. It was really fun because we had to create sentences that made no sense at all, but were true at the same time." Badru, year 6 - "I liked it when Mark sang his rap and when he taught us how to be original to make a great writer."

Our celebrated Young Writers now dare everyone to take part in the next writing challenge: ONCE UPON A DREAM. Remember to be original and think of something no one has thought of before. Poets love similes, personifications, metaphors, onomatopoeia etc. Why not use them in your poem? Imagery (describe your dreams so the reader can imagine what you are doing or seeing) is also important when writing a poem - use your senses and think about colours and movement, too.
