## SAFETY AND WELL BEING

### Attendance

Last year whole school attendance ended on a rather disappointing 94.9%. While we know that chickenpox played a negative effect on our figures we have fallen short of the government target of 96%. 96% attendance allows for the days where children are genuinely ill and cannot be in school. Missing just one or two days can make it really hard for your child to complete their work to the best of their abilities as they will be behind the other children in their sequence of learning.
