



On Thursday I met with Councillors Wells and Tickner to discuss an article that featured in the 'In Touch' magazine. Bromley council are considering whether there should be a roundabout at the junction of Foxgrove Road and Park Road with the view to closing Park Road. While I can see how a roundabout will help to ease the flow of traffic from Foxgrove Road I would be very concerned that there would be an increase in traffic on Brackley Road should Park Road be closed-particularly as there is no safe crossing point near the school. Both the councillors listened carefully and made some good suggestions about measures that could be put in place to manage traffic such as lowering the speed limit, installing speed cameras or increasing the number of speed awareness signs. During my discussions I highlighted the ongoing

difficulties we have with parking on the zig-zags and the lack of consequences for such actions. Councillor Tickner was very keen to support with this issue and has asked for photographic evidence. If you have any pictures of cars parked on the zig-zags or in front of the gates then please can you email them to me at the admin address or directly



to Councillor Tickner at michael.tickner@zip-mail.co.uk. At this stage there is no formal consultation but when it is released I will be sure to respond and would urge you to do the same. It could be a good opportunity to improve road safety and lobby for a much needed crossing point on Brackley Road.
