Our last Family Film Event before the summer break is a charity screening around the theme of teenage mental health. Come and enjoy Pixar's funny and moving film *INSIDE OUT* and express your innermost feelings by decorating a homemade biscuits with your favourite emoji.

*11 year-old Riley is struggling to deal with her family's move to the bright lights of San Francisco. Dealing with her mixed feelings are "Headquarters" – the area inside Riley's brain controlling all of her thoughts and emotions, populated by five diverse characters. At first, Joy is their dominant leader, but as Riley struggles to adjust to the challenges of a new city, home and school, other emotions – Anger, Fear, Disgust and Sadness – increasingly come to the fore. This hilarious, exciting adventure story shows Pixar on top form. As well as being hugely entertaining, the film comes with a poignant message, helping us to understand our own emotions and face up to some of the challenges involved in growing up.*
