Over the past week Langley Park Secondary Schools have released a consultation to change their admissions procedures. One of the proposals is for them to name feeder primary schools (Hawes Down, Clare House and Langley Primary). If this proposal were to be successful it would mean that 180 places would automatically be taken. Now although children from Worsley Bridge rarely access places at the Langley Schools it would put pressure on the other schools in the area (Eden Park High and Harris) to take children from schools they might not previously received them from, which in turn could leave Worsley Bridge with even less choice. I **URGE** you all to object to this proposal as it would create a very unfair admission procedure that could be detrimental to our children.
